The Smiths' story begins in Milwaukee. Richard (Dick), the son of Richard M. Smith Sr., grew up on Wells and 29th streets. Richard Sr. founded Lakeside Construction Company and began building homes and apartment buildings in 1936. He also served in the air force during World War II, refurbishing damaged planes. Dick's father always made time to connect with his family and spent time on the water often. The Smith family purchased their first Okauchee Lake property on Road O after a round on the golf course in 1947.

While Dick was working with his father in Milwaukee, he would often see a young woman walking to work at the bakery after school. He decided to meet Dorothy and went into her family's bakery to purchase an éclair. Dick proposed to

Dorothy after she graduated from high school and married her five years later. They enjoyed 64 blissful years of marriage while raising four children and 13 grandchildren, prior to her passing in 2014.

Dorothy's legacy will remain at Okauchee Lake Yacht Club (OLYC) with the donation of a defibrillator, following her passing.

In the early years of their marriage, Dick and Dorothy lived in Elm Grove, while spending summers at the cottage on Road O. Dick introduced sailing to the family by purchasing a wooden cub boat (X boat) after seeing one for sale on Bluemound Road. At that time, the boys did not know the first thing about sailing, but the Okauchee Lake community was eager to help them learn. The Smith family joined the yacht club, and all four children learned how to sail cub boats. Dick spent time sailing on the lake and at many regattas and blue chips, crewing on a C scow with Dr. Henschel.

After outgrowing the cottage on Road O, Dick and Dorothy purchased the family's current property on Bayview Road, where they have resided for 30 years. Dick built the home so that it would be available to anyone in the family who needed it. Over the past 30 years, Dick and Dorothy's four children and their families have all spent time living in the home.

The Smiths have been members of OLYC since the 1950s. Dick served as commodore and Dorothy was actively involved with the

Dave serves on the Okauchee Lake Sailing School board and is a past commodore of the yacht club.

They spend their summer months with Dick on Bayview Road or at their lake home on White Sand Lake outside of Minocqua. During the winter months, they reside in Elm Grove. Dick and Dorothy could never have imagined how close the Smith family would become and all of the memories they would make on Okauchee Lake. Time on the water and the sport of sailing have helped bring the Smith family together and tied them into the close-knit family they are today.
